New research and statistics

Employment, pay and workforce:

LGA statistical alert

The June 2018 statistical alert produced by LGA Research and Information shows that the Consumer Price Index including owner occupiers housing costs (CPIH) increased to 2.3 per cent in May 2018 from 2.2 per cent in April 2018. Retail Price Index (RPI) annual inflation decreased to 3.3 per cent in May 2018 from 3.4 per cent in April 2018.

The number of people in employment in Great Britain was 31,551,000 for the three months to April 2018; this has increased by 152,000 compared to the previous quarter to January 2018, from 31,399,000. Unemployment in Great Britain for the same periods was 1,387,000 for the quarter to April 2018, a decrease of 39,000 from 1,426,000 in the previous quarter to January 2018.

Figures provided by XpertHR, an online resource for employment law HR good practice and benchmarking, showed the median whole economy pay settlement level of 2.5 per cent to the three months ending May 2018, unchanged from 2.5 per cent for the three months April 2018.

Results from the Labour Research Department (LRD) survey provided by XpertHR showed the median level of union-negotiated awards for the whole economy was 3.3 per cent in the three months to May 2018 unchanged from 3.3 per cent for the previous three months to April 2018.

The Engineering Employers Federation mean (EEF, manufacturing) was 2.6 per cent in the three months to May 2018, an increase from 2.4 per cent for the three months to April 2018.

Local Government

Local government Formula Funding in England since 2013/14: lessons for future funding models

Since 2013/14, local government in England has received funding allocations on the basis of a set of funding formulas that were last recalculated around 2012, using data from that period and earlier. The ESRC Business and Local Government Data Research Centre at the University of Essex have reproduced the funding allocation mechanism in a different format (the computer language R), and used their reimplementation to examine various features of the mechanism.

House price statistics for small areas - quarter 4 (rolling calendar quarter), England

In quarter four (rolling calendar quarter) there were 837,501 residential property sales in England, this compares to 873,957 for the corresponding quarter in 2016. For the same periods the median price paid for all residential sales in England increased from £224,950 in quarter four 2016 to £234,000 in quarter four 2017.

Quarterly public sector employment statistics – quarter 1 2018, England

The number of employees, permanent in England in quarter one 2018 was 1,176,200 (headcount), this has fallen from 1,241,300 in quarter one 2017. This is an estimate of the total number of local authority employees with permanent employment arrangements. Employees with fixed-term contracts of more than 12 months are classed as permanent employees (regardless of the amount of time remaining on the contract). This is a total headcount and does not take into account the number of hours worked.

In England the syphilis diagnosis rate per 100,000 population in 2017 was 12.5, an increase from 10.5 in 2016 and 5.5 in 2012 - This is all syphilis diagnoses among people of all ages accessing genito-urinary medicine (GUM) services in the area who are residents in England, expressed as a rate per 100,000 population
