



Key messages

- 1. LAs are the delivery mechanism for most waste reforms
- 2. Council finances under immense pressure, and impact of waste reforms is £ huge
- Continued funding uncertainty is preventing council decisions and investment
- 4. Our budgets can't cope with ETS market price volatility
- 5. Pursue 'polluter pays principle' to effectively link waste policy, financial levers and carbon impacts
